



GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS AND SHORT PAPERS

- The conference language is **English**. All abstracts or proceedings must be submitted in English.
- Abstracts must be submitted online. Do not fax, mail or email abstracts, they will not be considered.
- In order to make a presentation at the conference, please submit an abstract by filling out the abstract or proceeding submission form.
- Please note that accepted abstracts can only be programmed for a poster or an oral presentation if at least one author has registered for participation at the conference and has paid the registration fees.
- Registered authors can submit up to **two abstracts**, either as a one-page abstract or preferentially, a four-page short paper. For selection of oral presentations, preference will be given to four-page short papers. Short papers could be published in Organohalogen Compounds (as an option).

Before starting your online submission

- Prepare **personal data** (title, authors' details...) that are to be included in the form - please note that the information used and published in the scientific program and book of abstracts will be taken from this form.
- The submitter will be considered as the **presenting author** and will receive all future correspondence from the DIOXIN 2020 organization.
- **Co-authors**: Enter the details of co-authors in the order you want them to appear.
- For **four-page short paper submission**: Prepare your **PDF file** according to the template provided.
- For **one-page abstract submission**: The **abstract text** should be prepared in English and entered online in the corresponding field (no more than 4,000 characters, spaces included). The abstract should be concise and factual, with a maximum of 4,000 characters. The contents should include the purpose of the research, methods employed in the study, the principal results and major conclusions. As the abstract should be able to stand alone, references should be avoided. Also, non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided, but if essential these must be defined at their first mention in the abstract. No illustration or figure can be submitted in this format.
- The **Keywords** will help the Scientific committee to assign your submission to the relevant session.
